I hope everyone is doing well and hope to see you out and about at Lions events.



Lion Portal Important Dates!

7/15/23-7/24/23: Target Conversion Date

Before 6/15/23: Enter all club officers for 2023-2024

Before 6/15/23: Enter service activity for events prior to 6/1/23. Reporting for 6/1/23 going forward will be in the new system after conversion

Before 6/15/23: Record any club or donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognition.

Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!
- Training is slated to begin in late April 2023 Stay tuned!



Just a reminder your clubs should have put together a nominating committee in the month of March and come up with a list of officers to vote on in April.

That list of officers needs to be voted on and entered in MyLCI **BEFORE** June 5th!!!

Lions is upgrading the portal to better serve the population of Lions and to make all the systems work together. They will be shutting down changes in mid June and moving to the new portal by end of July.

UPDATE YOUR LION ACCOUNT INFORMATION

Make sure your Lion Account information is correct and up to date in MyLCI or your regional reporting system. Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique ID. Unshared email and phone numbers will NO longer be supported as a log in credential.

If you're a club president, secretary or administrator, updating member information is simple:

- Log in to the current member portal with your Lion Account credentials
- Navigate to MyLCI
- Select "My Lion Club"
- Select "Members"
- Click on the member whose information you need to update
- Select "Edit Member" to enter in their revised email address and other updated information
