February can be a rough month. It's just about the dead middle of winter, with cold temperatures and gray days clouding moods, and it feels like it just about lasts forever. The holidays are long over, with not much to look forward to until spring turns up. But then, Happy Groundhog Day! All eyes, especially those in PA, turn to Punxsutawney to see if Phil will emerge from his nook. Did Phil see his shadow? Are warm temperatures on the way? It's also the time of year where you can't turn on the tv and not see Harold Ramis' Groundhog Day, which happens to celebrate its 30th anniversary this month. It's easy to call Groundhog Day a goofy high-concept comedy but in the midst of winter, it's hilarious, entertaining, touching, and has lessons for improving one's life, community, and the world.

Lesson 1: Focus on others and not yourself. Your Happiness is the Happiness of Others.

Phil Connors (Bill Murray) is stuck in life in more ways than one. Things improve for him only when he starts helping as many people as possible (i.e., buying his co-workers coffee, saving a child from a tree, or fixing an old lady's flat tire). The film suggests life's true rewards and the path to a meaningful existence is by helping others, especially those who cannot reciprocate. Lesson 2: Got downtime? Make the most of it.

Whether it's for a minute, an hour, a day or more, we've all been made to sit around waiting. This actually provides us with a great opportunity to do stuff we might not otherwise. Lesson 3: Misery is doing the same thing and expecting different results.

If we want things to change, we have to be willing to change. Embracing change is the way to revitalize Lions Club International.

So...What IS Service...??

Service is hands-on activities, such as tree planting, rebuilding homes after disaster strikes, or serving those in need. But there are so many other ways to serve!

<u>Advocacy</u> – Raising awareness of the causes that are important to Lions (see back), educating our communities on issues that impact them, and working with others to bring about positive change. Some of the



easiest examples are handout out flyers with meals or have information out to educate the community.

<u>Donations</u> – Making Charitable donations to individuals in need or to organizations. For example, the Lions Clubs International Foundation. Funds donated to LCIF are tracked by the foundation and do not need to be reported as a service activity.

Fundraising - Raising funds to ensure the continuation of service.

Service support activities – This includes the following four categories

- Holding monthly meetings to strengthen your club, educate and train members, or plan other service activities.
- Fulfilling administrative tasks, such as maintaining club records or reporting to LCI.
- 3. Attending events such as conventions, forums, or your local zone social.
- Engaging in fellowship and fun, together with other Lions and prospective Lions and Leos. One way to do that is to attend PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp's 75th Birthday on July 16th.

These activities contribute to the Lions' positive impact in various ways including attracting new members to clubs, helping clubs retain members by providing a positive experience, preparing Lions to serve, or directly benefiting the people we serve.

But...What IS NOT Service..??

Many Lions and Leos serve their communities individually, outside of the activities planned by their clubs, districts, or multiple districts. Some examples include bringing a meal to a neighbor, driving a parent to a medical appointment, or volunteering at their place of worship. This work is important and commendable; however, it should not be reported as a Lions' service activity.

Any service can be reported through MyLion or by sending the information to me, your GST, and I will gladly input it.
