Advencesy Relating awareness of the causes that are important to Llone, educating our communities on leaves that impect them and working with others to bring about positive change. Some examples include hooting a Strides walk for diabetes awareness or visiting a local lawmater to clinicals the needs of the blind or visually impaired.

Denations: Making charitable donations to injuniduals or organizations, including Llons Clubs international Foundation (LCIF). Funds donated to LCIF are backed by the foundation and need not be reported as a service activity.

Fundraising: Raising funds to enable our service.

Service support activities: This encompasses four broad categories:

- Hotoing meetings to strengthen your olub, educate and train members, or plan other service activities.
- Full ling indramitative tasks, such as running enands, maintaining club records, or reporting.
- Attending Lions events such as conventions and fatures.
- Dropaging in fellowship and fun, Together with other Lions.

These activities contribute to Lions' positive impact in various ways, including attracting new members to clubs, helping clubs retain members by providing a positive experience, preparing Lions to serve, or directly benefitting the people we serve.

What is not reportable service?
