Clubs that do not respond will be receiving a personal phone call from me.

Again, I need to emphasize the importance of bringing in and retaining new members in our clubs as the best and only way to perpetuate and maintain strength for the immediate and long-term future.

My message this month is focused on the Club Membership Chairperson. In "My Lion" LCI website there are countless valuable learning modules, one being "Club Membership Chairperson" that is in line with the LCI 1.5 initiative. I want to briefly detail the Club Membership Chairperson and why it is so important that each club designate a member for this position.

The 4 Steps of the Recruiting Process

Step 1 Appoint a club membership Chairperson and form a membership committee

Decide what your club would like to accomplish and how new members will help that effort.

Form a member recruitment team.



Step 2 Create a club growth plan

Who will you recruit Where to focus recruiting efforts Gather materials you will need for outreach Plan and promote your informational meeting

Step 3 Implement your growth plan

Reach out to target members as outlined in steps 1 & 2 Follow up with meeting attendees Review your growth plan and adjust timeliness as necessary

Step 4 Welcome new members

- Conduct an induction ceremony
- Ensure new members are properly onboarded through orientation
- Use the new membership Questionnaire to bring new members' voices to the club
- I offer my services to any and all clubs as an advisor and will visit any club during a regular meeting date to give a brief presentation on membership development. If time allows, I would encourage a brief brainstorming session to get your respective clubs on the right path.

Every club must consider membership growth a top priority and I look forward to help making that happen.


